Areas of Learning

Communication and Language

This term your child will be involved in a variety of activities designed to develop their speaking and listening skills. Children will be listening to stories and will be encouraged to respond to what they hear with relevant comments and questions.

Role play will be an important part of the curriculum this term and the children will be acting out different scenarios in the Superhero Cave, Ice-cream shop, Seaside, amongst other role play experiences.


Physical Development

Children will be continuing to develop their fine motor skills. They will learn to hold and use pencils, paint brushes, scissors and craft tools correctly so that they can write, paint and cut with increasing accuracy.

The children will be encouraged to move with imagination and coordination in our P.E. lessons, utilising the space, skills and apparatus in both the indoor and outdoor environment.

As children become more confident they will be encouraged to participate in more team games and activities.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Throughout this term in Reception your child will be developing their awareness of their own feelings and the feelings of others. They will be recognising and valuing their own achievements and working towards personal goals. We will be learning to develop respect for their own cultures and beliefs and those of other people through a range of multicultural activities.

Our SEAL themes for this term are:

- *Going for goals*
- *Good to be me.*

Literacy

Your child will be continuing to develop their phonic knowledge through Letterland and 'Phonic Bug', this term. They will be learning to recognise, write and use the different phonemes and will be blending letter sounds together to build words and form simple sentences.

We will be learning to read a range of familiar and common words and simple sentences independently. Together we will be sharing a range of stories to develop their understanding of story structure.

At home children can use, *BUG CLUB*, our online reading programme, to access reading books at home and enhance your child's learning. Just log onto www.activelearnprimary.co.uk and type in your child's log in information to access the eBooks.

Mathematics

We will be introducing the concept of money this term through role play and various practical games and experiences.

We will be learning to count, recognise, write and order numbers beyond 10 through a range of games and mathematical activities.

This term we will begin to use the vocabulary involved in adding and subtracting and we will be talking about and creating different patterns.

At home children can log onto *PURPLE MASH* and play some of the Maths games on 'Maths City 2' (found in the Early Years section).

Understanding the World

The children will be learning about Superheroes this term. They will be provided with a wide range of tools and resources and encouraged to develop their own ideas and build creatively. They will also be given more specific activities, for example, to make a Superhero mask or design a Superhero logo.

We will continue to extend the children's ICT knowledge and skills through the use of various computer programs and programmable toys.

We will be learning about different countries and places around the world through 'Barnaby Bear'. The children will learn about Barnaby Bears adventures as well as have the opportunity to take him home and write about the experiences they share with him in Barnaby's Diary.

At home children can log onto PURPLE MASH, select the 'Topics' folder and write about their own Superhero.

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will be continuing to explore colour, texture, shape and space in their creative activities. We will use their work on Superheroes as a basis for much of our art, design and technology activities. Children will be responding to what they see, hear, touch, smell and feel when exploring objects and materials.

Please continue to support your child at home by also:

- Ensuring your child brings their book bag to school and changes their book regularly.
- Encouraging your child to play various number games including addition, subtraction and using money.
- Helping your child to recognise the numbers on their current target sheet.
- Helping your child to identify and sound the phonemes we are learning at school.
- Practicing recognising the high frequency words in their current set.
- Encouraging your child to complete activities independently, for example, dressing, undressing and fastening their own coat.
- Using Purple Mash and Bug Club on the computer.
