Year 1

This Week...

In English, the children have enjoyed learning about the story of 'Duffy' the sea turtle. They have written a recount of what happened to Duffy using time connectives. The children have enjoyed creating pieces of underwater artwork, inspired by the Argentinian artist Carlos Hiller. They have been using lots of skills to create their artwork including sketching, collage and painting. In Reading Detectives, the children have enjoyed continuing to find out about the story 'The Tin Forest. They thought carefully about what rubbish the old man might have found. In Jigsaw, the children have been thinking carefully about their goals and what steps they need to put in place to achieve them.















Thís Week...

In English this week, Year 2 have written a nonchronological report on mammals. We have used lots of adjectives to describe these, using commas in the correct places. This week in maths, we have identified unit and non-unit fractions correctly. In computing, we have created a table of data on a spreadsheet. This helped us to then produce charts and graphs using this data. In science this week, we have focused on the differences between a baby and a child. It has been interesting to look at how we have grown and all the skills we have learned now that we are children. In Jigsaw, we have talked about how working with others can help us to learn.
